

PE and Sports Premium Money 2016 - 2017

The Government is providing funding of £150 million per annum for the academic years 2015/16 until 2020 to provide new, substantial primary school sport funding. This funding is being jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport, and will see money going directly to primary school head teachers to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all their children. The sport funding can only be spent on sport and PE provision in schools.

Purpose of the funding

Schools will have to spend the sport funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but they will have the freedom to choose they do this. Possible uses for the funding include:

- hiring specialist PE teachers or qualified sports coaches to work alongside primary teachers when teaching PE
- new or additional Change4Life sport clubs
- paying for professional development opportunities in PE/sport
- providing cover to release primary teachers for professional development in PE/sport
- running sport competitions, or increasing participation in the school games
- buying quality assured professional development modules or materials for PE/sport
- providing places for pupils on after school sport clubs and holiday clubs

This year St Matthew's Primary School will receive £9000. We intend to spend this money on the following:

£795	<p><u>Dance Desk: Learning Community Support Consultancy</u> DanceDesk, provides consultancy for individual schools and forms part of a network of local and regional schools. Support is delivered through cluster school meetings, training and specialist conferences. It aims to develop the quality of provision and assessment across the whole school. £900	<p><u>Level 5/6 Professional Certificate Primary School Specialism Physical Education and School Sport</u> To support the development and training of a new PE Leader and to improve standards and participation in PE and Sport. The subject leader will further develop systems to critically evaluate PE provision and measure impact. Support high quality PE teaching and subject leadership.</p>
£1,800	<p><u>Supply Cover for Level 5 Professional Development</u> 8 days: Level 5 / 6 Professional Certificate Primary School Specialism Physical Education and School Sport</p>

£2,413.00	<u>Additional Swimming Hours – Summer Term</u> The aim of the intervention is to raise attainment in swimming through more pupils leaving our school swimming at least 25m unaided. Additional 12hours of swimming lessons have been secured with an additional member of staff to promote accelerated learning. Additional hours are for year 6 (priority) / year 5 during the Summer Term.
£520	<u>Hiring of specialist teachers to inspire and develop pupils skills</u> Nursery: Dance of the Animals Workshop (£30) - Children to develop gross motor, rhythm and movement skills linked to their topic animals. Reception: Bhangra Dance Workshops (£180) – (x3 workshops) Children to develop confidence and rhythmic skills through cultural music and dance. Year 1: Archery (£77) - Children to develop target skills through archery games and exercises, linked to their PE topic ‘Hit the Target’ and history topic ‘Castles’. Year 2: Dance of the Animals Workshop (£30) - Children to develop dance skills through workshop hook using their bodies to create animal shapes and movements. Year 3: Archery (£77) Children to develop target skills through archery games and exercises, linked to their PE topic ‘Hit the Target’. Year 4: Archery (£77) - Children to develop target skills through archery games and exercises, linked to their PE topic ‘Hit the Target’ and history topic ‘Anglo-saxons’. Year 5: Greek Dancing (£150) – Pupils to take part in ancient Greek dancing developing team work, unison and sequence skills. Linked to their PE topic dance and history topic ‘The Greeks’. Year 6: Basketball (in school specialist no cost)
£1,100	<u>Complete Kidz</u> Provide opportunities for all pupils to take part in PE and Sport after school to support the school aim of increasing participation rates, raising attainment in PE and increasing fitness levels. Pupils will develop key skills, co-ordination and balance.
£500	<u>Staff to support after school club (outside agency)</u> To ensure the safety and welfare of all pupils and in-line with national safety requirements school will ensure a member of staff is supporting in after school clubs where an outside agency is used.
£162	<u>New Basketball Club – Resources</u> Provide new basketball club led by school learning mentor with the resources needed to run a successful club both indoors and outdoors. The aim of the club is to develop pupils social and emotional skills through team building and collaboration and to develop pupils confidence and basic skills through competitive sport. The club will work towards inter-school competitions. Resources required include basketballs, bibs and indoor net.
£300	<u>Young Leader Award (Year 6 or end of Year 5)</u> Encourage pupils to develop their leadership skills through sport and PE activities. Pupils will have the opportunity to become leaders, developing their speaking and listening skills, confidence and Olympic values. Successful pupils completing the program receive a certificate to recognise their achievements.
£300	<u>Resources</u> Additional resources for PE are required to support teachers to deliver high quality, differentiated and exciting lessons. Resources required include medals for sports day to promote and celebrate successes in sport. Range of balls needed (tennis, foam, football) to replace and replenish stock. Ribbons to support dance in Year 1 and Early years.
£210	<u>Inter-school Competitions</u> To provide transport to allow pupils to compete in the ‘Sandwell Primary Games’ competitions and events. The purpose of the competitions are to drive success and promote excellence while allowing pupils the opportunity to showcase their talents and compete against other schools.
